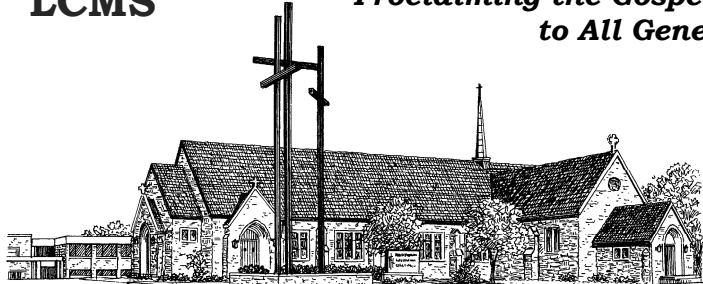

THE INVOCATION, CONFESSION & ABSOLUTION

P (Pastor): In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C (Congregation): Amen.

P: From the Word which God has sown, a harvest will be gathered in.

C: But hardened ground and rocks and thorns all struggle to suppress God's Word.

P: “My Word shall not return to me empty,” says the Lord. “It shall accomplish the thing for which I sent it.”

C: If we confess our sins, God, who is faithful and just, will forgive our sins, and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

P: So let the seed be sown.

(Silence for reflection and self-examination)

P: Lord of the living harvest:

C: we confess that we have sinned. In our thinking, speaking, doing--proper fruit has not been borne. Your final harvest fills our hearts with fear. For the sake of Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive our sins, remove our guilt, inspire our hearts--that we may bear fruit and yield thirty...sixty...and a hundredfold.

P: "My Word shall accomplish the thing for which I sent it," says the Lord. Like a grain of wheat buried in the earth, Jesus Christ was given into death for you. And He has borne abundant fruit! In Him there is forgiveness, life, and resurrection from the dead. By Him we are redeemed and set at liberty. Your sins are forgiven.

C: How great the harvest God provides! Amen.

THE OLD TESTAMENT READING: Isaiah 55:10–13

P: The Old Testament Reading for the Sixth Sunday after Pentecost is from the 55th chapter of Isaiah.

¹⁰ “For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven
and do not return there but water the earth,
making it bring forth and sprout,
giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater,
¹¹ so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth;
it shall not return to me empty,
but it shall accomplish that which I purpose,
and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it.

¹² “For you shall go out in joy
and be led forth in peace;
the mountains and the hills before you
shall break forth into singing,
and all the trees of the field shall clap their hands.

¹³ Instead of the thorn shall come up the cypress;
instead of the brier shall come up the myrtle;
and it shall make a name for the LORD,

THE EPISTLE: Romans 8:12–17

P: The Epistle is from the 8th chapter of Romans.

¹² So then, brothers, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh. ¹³ For if you live according to the flesh you will die, but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. ¹⁴ For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. ¹⁵ For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry, “Abba! Father!” ¹⁶ The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, ¹⁷ and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with him in order that we may also be glorified with him. (ESV)

P: This is the Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God.

(Please stand)

THE VERSE *(Spoken)*

All: Alleluia. The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever. Alleluia. (ESV)

THE HOLY GOSPEL: Matthew 13:1–9, 18–23

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the 13th chapter.

C: *(Spoken)* Glory to You, O Lord.

¹ That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat beside the sea. ² And great crowds gathered about him, so that he got into a boat and sat down. And the whole crowd stood on the beach. ³ And he told them many things in parables, saying: “A sower went out to sow. ⁴ And as he sowed, some seeds fell along the path, and the birds came and devoured them. ⁵ Other seeds fell on rocky ground, where they did not have much soil, and immediately they sprang up, since they had no depth of soil, ⁶ but when the sun rose they were scorched. And since they had no root, they withered away. ⁷ Other seeds fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. ⁸ Other seeds fell on good soil and produced grain, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. ⁹ He who has ears, let him hear.”

¹⁸ “Hear then the parable of the sower: ¹⁹ When anyone hears the word of the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what has been sown in his heart. This is what was sown

along the path. ²⁰ As for what was sown on rocky ground, this is the one who hears the word and immediately receives it with joy, ²¹ yet he has no root in himself, but endures for a while, and when tribulation or persecution arises on account of the word, immediately he falls away. ²² As for what was sown among thorns, this is the one who hears the word, but the cares of the world and the deceitfulness of riches choke the word, and it proves unfruitful. ²³ As for what was sown on good soil, this is the one who hears the word and understands it. He indeed bears fruit and yields, in one case a hundredfold, in another sixty, and in another thirty.” (ESV)

P: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

C: *(Spoken)* Praise to You, O Christ.

THE APOSTLES’ CREED

All: I believe in God the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

THE SIXTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

The Preaching of the Word of Christ

Bears the Good Fruits of Faith and Love

As “*the rain and the snow come down from heaven*” and “*water the earth, making it bring forth and sprout*” (Is. 55:10), so the Word of God accomplishes the purpose for which He speaks it, granting joy and peace through the forgiveness of sins and producing the fruits of faith and love in those who are called by His name. Christ Jesus, the incarnate Word, has established the name of the Lord as “*an everlasting sign that shall not be cut off*” (Is. 55:13). He opens our ears to hear, our minds to understand and our hearts to believe His Word, lest the evil one come and snatch it away. He thus transforms our rocky hearts into good soil, which clings to the Gospel and “*indeed bears fruit*” (Matt. 13:23). He is Himself the firstfruits of all who “*have received the Spirit of adoption as sons*” (Rom. 8:15). Thus being “*led by the Spirit of God,*” we are not afraid, but we cry out in faith to our Father in heaven (Rom. 8:14–15). For as we suffer with Christ, the beloved Son, so shall we “*also be glorified with him*” (Rom. 8:17).

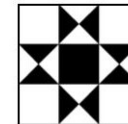

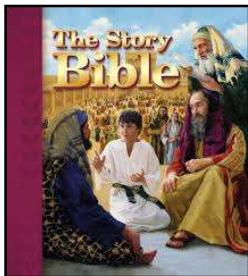
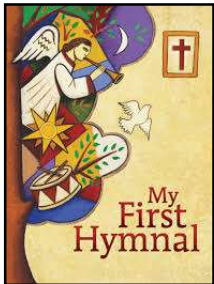
LIVE RECORDINGS: On Sunday, June 7, at the 8:30AM service, we had our first live broadcast of a service. Up until that time, the services were recorded on Saturday mornings, edited (adding pre-recorded organ and vocal music), and then put up for viewing beginning the next day.

Several people have commented that the volume of the live broadcast seems low or weak, especially for the music (organ and vocal).

We are in the process of moving and/or installing some new equipment. We hope to improve this aspect of the live recordings. Please be patient with us as we deal with this very new part of our ministry.

Some folks have also asked about being able to hear more congregational singing. While we plan to install another microphone to help pick this up, please understand that with people wearing masks (something needed especially during singing) and seating arrangements that follow social distancing guidelines, it is quite understandable that the singing will not be as usual.

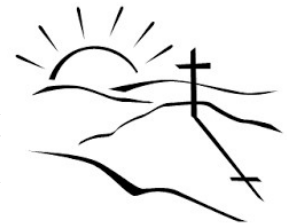
Email News from Redeemer

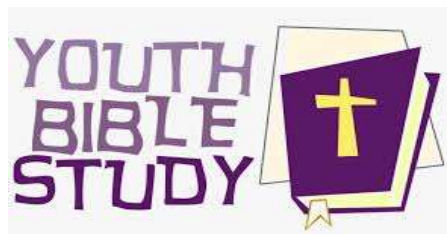
Start Your Morning Right with God's WORD

This summer, our Sunday School students will explore **3 in 1: Discovering Our Triune God**. Each of the weekly Bible stories helps students discover something about our triune God. What will we discover? Where did the world come from? Are angels real? Is Jesus really God? What does the Holy Spirit do for us? These answers will be unveiled to us week by week as we discover together just who the Trinity is. Sunday School Superintendent, Mrs. Jill Walrod, will email lessons to you each Sunday. Topic—July 12: Today in Sunday School, students explore “Jesus Is True Man: Jesus Is Born.” Children will learn how God sent His Son, Jesus, to be born on earth so He could keep the Law for them and also be able to suffer and die in their place. Consider discussing, “*How was the birth of Jesus a fulfillment of God’s promises?*”

Topic—July 19: In today’s Sunday School lesson, “Jesus Is True God: Jesus Rebukes the Storm,” children will learn how Jesus is the true God who stilled the storm. Families could discuss, “*How does Jesus continue to do the works of God in our lives?*”

Topic—July 26: “Jesus Is Our Savior: Jesus Suffers and Dies” is the title of this week’s Sunday School lesson. Students will discuss how Jesus has redeemed them though they are lost and condemned creatures. Consider asking, “*Why was the death and resurrection of Jesus necessary?*”

Topic—August 2: Today’s Sunday School lesson explores, “Jesus Is Our Lord: Jesus Ascends to Heaven.” Students will learn that after Jesus descended into hell and rose again from the dead, He ascended into heaven to prepare a place for all believers. Families could discuss, “*What does it mean to you that Jesus has gone to prepare a place for us?*”
